MCC offers an LPN to RN Bridge program for LPNs wishing to continue their education and pursue an ADN or AAS degree. Completing this nursing program qualifies you to sit for the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Examination (NCLEX-RN*), which is the final step to licensure as a Registered Professional Nurse (RN).

- Have an unencumbered Illinois LPN license
- Complete the following prerequisite courses

Other Information

The cumulative GPA for general education and prerequisite courses must equal 2.5 or better. Students must earn a grade of C or better in each of the prerequisite courses.

A proficiency exam for HCE 110 is available for those confident in their medication math skills. A fee of \$25 is charged when you sign up to take the exam in the MCC Testing Center. Credit will be awarded for a score of 75% or better.

For students who have completed Anatomy & Physiology with a grade of C or better more than five years ago, a refresher course is offered to fulfill this requirement. Please speak to the Director of Nursing regarding this course. This course is offered as a noncredit course.

MAT 099, or MAT 020 and MAT 120, or a college algebra course with a C or better, or placement into MAT 161 on the Math Placement Exam is required.

Students must also take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS). This is a pre-entrance exam for all nursing candidates. MCC offers four test dates per year, two in the spring and two in the fall. Please check the MCC Testing Center website for registration instructions. You must register for the TEAS exam one week prior to the testing date. See www.mchenry.edu/testingcenter for registration instructions.
