

**Agreement for an Intercollegiate Program
between
Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy
and
McHenry Community College**

This document states the terms of an articulation agreement for a program leading to preferred admission review for the Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Concordia University Wisconsin.

This agreement is effective as of the date it is fully executed by both parties and will remain in effect for a period of one year. Thereafter, this agreement shall be automatically extended on an annual basis. Either party may terminate this agreement by written notice to the other party by March 1st of each year. In the event of a termination for any reason by either party, the students presently accepted in the Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy will be permitted to complete the program. This agreement may be modified at any time with the written agreement of both parties.

Both institutions enter into this agreement in order to better facilitate the admission of McHenry Community College (MCC) students to the Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy (CUWSOP). The General Terms of the Agreement are as follows:

1. CUWSOP agrees to grant a Doctor of Pharmacy degree to those MCC students who gain acceptance into Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy, and successfully complete the doctor of pharmacy degree requirements specified in the Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy catalog at the time of admission to Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy.

MCC agrees to provide the following, or comparable, mathematics, science and liberal studies coursework. This coursework must be completed by the time a MCC student starts classes at CUWSOP as the coursework is the pre-pharmacy requirements for the PharmD degree.

2. Each MCC pre-pharmacy student requesting admission to Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy will submit the appropriate application for admission, application fee, test scores, official transcript from MCC, and any other necessary transcripts or credentials in support of his/her application, as required by the policies CUWSOP.
3. Concordia University Wisconsin School of Pharmacy agrees to guarantee a preferred interview appointment to MCC students opting for the pathway who have met the following criteria:
 - a. Successful progress in the pre-pharmacy coursework with a C or better at MCC. All required pre-pharmacy coursework must be completed by the time a MCC student starts classes at CUWSOP but can be in progress (not complete) at the time of the application and interview.
 - b. Submission of the PharmCAS application by June 1 the year they plan to enroll in the PharmD program.
 - c. Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 out of 4.0 in all MCC coursework.
4. With the student's prior written consent, MCC will identify potential students for the program with CUWSOP. CUWSOP will assist in mentoring those students while they are enrolled at the MCC, including the provision of mock interviews or other interview preparation support as necessary. CUWSOP will offer preferred interviews to all MCC

students in the program who meet the admissions criteria (stated above in number 2). Concordia may elect to offer interviews to candidates below these thresholds. These thresholds represent guaranteed interviews.


5. MCC agrees to market the pathway to interested enrolled students and to allow the admissions office of CUWSOP preferred access to MCC students through scheduled recruiting events and other communication avenues. The partnership will be promoted on both MCC's and on CUWSOP's websites.
6. The Appendix further describes personnel roles and responsibilities from each institution that will collaborate and communicate to support students' progress and process in this program.
7. This agreement is not assignable by either party without the prior written consent of the other party.


