For refrigerators, freezers, and other Freon-bearing appliances, proof of proper Freon removal may be required prior to recycling. Fees may apply—check with waste hauler.

They do not accept aerosols, nail polish, or wooden eyeliners, and items should be no larger than the size of your fist. While stand-alone Sephora stores accept clean makeup packaging for recycling, Sephora locations within Kohl's do not participate in this program.

## Battery recycling is now free and easier than ever.

Thanks to the Portable and Medium Format Battery Stewardship Act, residents, businesses, schools, and local governments can recycle most household batteries at no cost through The Battery Network, selected by the Illinois EPA to operate the statewide program. That means across McHenry County and throughout Illinois, safe battery recycling is now within reach.

### What batteries are covered?

From collection to transport, The Battery Network makes safe battery recycling possible. The program covers three categories of batteries:

- Primary (single-use) and rechargeable batteries commonly found in homes and businesses, powering remote controls, toys, cordless tools, and more.
- Large rechargeable batteries (up to 25 lbs), such as those used in lawn equipment and e-bikes.
- Damaged or defective batteries that are no longer safe to use due to physical damage or malfunction, such as leaking, cracked, or swollen batteries. These must be taken to designated locations equipped to manage them safely.

Illinois law now requires acceptance of all covered batteries, including alkaline. While alkaline batteries are not prohibited from landfill disposal until January 1, 2028, they can and should be recycled today.

The law does not include embedded batteries that are not designed to be removed, automotive lead-acid batteries, EV batteries, nor recalled batteries, which remain the responsibility of the manufacturer.

### Funded by manufacturers, not taxpayers

This program is funded entirely by battery manufacturers and brands, not taxpayers. Even state oversight is covered through manufacturer fees. That means Illinois residents can recycle covered batteries at no cost.

### Safe battery recycling starts with you

Before dropping off lithium batteries, individually bag each battery or tape the terminals to prevent sparks and reduce fire risk during storage and transport. Protecting lithium battery terminals helps reduce the risk of fires in homes, collection trucks, and waste facilities.

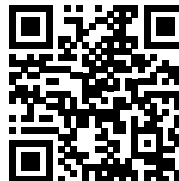

## MEDICINE AND SHARPS:

The Illinois Drug Take-Back Act went fully into effect on December 1, 2023, requiring pharmaceutical companies to fund programs for medication take-back kiosks in McHenry County for old and unwanted prescriptions. When disposing of sharps, put them in a strong, plastic container, such as a detergent jug or a designated sharps bin. When ready to drop off, seal the container with duct tape. In 2023, the Illinois General Assembly passed the Paint Stewardship Act, an example of an Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) policy. EPR places the responsibility for managing products at the end of their useful life on the manufacturers and producers of those products.

PaintCare Inc., a non-profit organization representing paint manufacturers, operates the paint stewardship programs in the eleven states with paint stewardship laws. The program works by adding a one dollar per gallon fee to each new can of paint sold in the state. ### Where to take them:

Plastic film and bags are collected at most grocery stores and big box stores such as Best Buy, Target, Walmart etc. The collection boxes are most often found in the entryway to the store.

### How do I know if it's plastic film?

1. See if the plastic will stretch when you pull it. If yes, it can be included. If it tears like paper, please don't put it in the collection container for plastic film.
2. Is the plastic shiny or does it make a crinkly/crunchy sound in your hand? If yes, do not recycle in the collection container for plastic film.

### What about the plastic bags from Amazon, UPS, FedEx, etc.?

Most of these can be recycled in the plastic film collection boxes. Look for the How2Recycle or NexTrex label. These can indicate that this item can be added to the plastic film collection boxes and bins at area big box stores and grocery stores. These items do not have to have these labels to be recycled, but some do.

## EMPTY PRESCRIPTION BOTTLES

Please make sure to take-off any labels that may have personal information and shred before recycling. Most CVS and Walgreens Pharmacies have collection boxes for empty pill bottles.

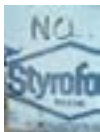
**Styrofoam must be clean—no grease, food stains, etc. Please remove tape, staples, etc.**

The Environmental Defenders of McHenry County's styrofoam collection program has been suspended. Please check the Defenders website for any updates at [www.mcdef.org](http://www.mcdef.org). You can take your Styrofoam to the Chicago Logistic Service site, or if you are a McHenry Township resident, to one of their events this spring and summer.

### COLLECTION LOCATIONS:

- **Chicago Logistic Service**, 701 Wesemann Dr., West Dundee. Accepts styrofoam and bubble wrap in the rear of the building by door #114. There is a clearly marked container outside for 24/7 drop-off.
- **McHenry Township Road District**, 3703 N. Richmond Rd., Johnsburg, at their drop-off events on Saturdays from 8 a.m.–12 p.m.: April 18, May 16, June 20, July 18, Aug. 15, Sept. 19, and Oct. 17. **Residents only.**

### WHAT IS ACCEPTED?



- White or colored solid Styrofoam from packaging or the grocery store that will break or crack, with no food residue, grease, tape, or labels on it.



- Coolers free of food residue, grease, tape, or labels are accepted.
- Solid packing peanuts that do not fold or bend are accepted. Please put them in a bag.



### WHAT IS NOT ACCEPTED?

- Construction material used to insulate buildings. If it has a colored cover on the foam, it's not acceptable.
- If it folds, bends, or can be wrapped around anything, it's not acceptable. Volunteers have to throw it away.
- Bubble wrap or air packs. Volunteers will have to throw it away. These items can be dropped off at stores with plastic recycling bins (let the air out of the air packs).

# RECYCLE COACH

## Recycle Coach was designed to help residents know “What Goes Where.”

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has partnered with Recycle Coach to provide local governments in Illinois with free access to this innovative recycling education platform. Recycle Coach gives residents access to advanced digital tools through both an online platform and a mobile app. The “What Goes Where” tool is one of the key components that will help all Illinois residents understand how to properly recycle, manage non-recyclables, and properly dispose of other household wastes.

Not sure where or how to recycle a bicycle? With the “What Goes Where” tool, residents can select their town from a drop-down menu and type in the name of the item they want to recycle. For example, searching “bicycle” provides general recycling and disposal recommendations, as well as nearby drop-off and recycling locations.

BONUS: Mobile app users can search items by snapping a picture on their phone!

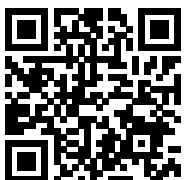
## The other two key components are the Calendar and the Discovery Zone:

**The Calendar** is a localized tool for each participating municipality. Residents can search for their municipality to view collection schedules for curbside trash, recycling, and organics. The calendar also typically includes special collection events, such as Christmas tree pickup, as well as all county-supported recycling events. App users can opt in to receive reminders on their phones to ensure bins are set out on time. Municipalities may also choose to add additional events and services to their Recycle Coach calendars, such as street sweeping or hydrant flushing. (McHenry County will be working with municipalities this year to support onboarding and keep calendars up to date.)

**The Discovery Zone** is available on both the website and mobile app for all McHenry County residents. Looking for more recycling information? The Discovery Zone features videos and blog posts covering some of the most relevant topics in recycling today, along with activity packs for kids of all ages.



The hope is that the use of Recycle Coach will decrease confusion about recycling, decrease the amount of contamination (non-recyclables or “Wishcycling”) going to the recycling facilities, increase the amount of proper materials diverted from Illinois landfills, and prevent environmental contamination.
