3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

8. PRESIDENT'S REPORT: DR. CLINTON GABBARD

MCC Store Update

Dr. Gabbard gave an update on MCC Store. He noted that in July 2020, the MCC Store completed a dynamic renovation to its existing footprint. However, due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions, it was unable to physically open at that time. So, during the 2020-2021 academic year, the MCC Store functioned primarily as an online store, where both students and other customers placed orders for their books or merchandise through the online store, then picked up their orders from a counter at the

store entrance. As a result, the store's sales were \$786,694.02 for the year, while expenses were \$986,347.08, resulting in a \$199,952.06 deficit.

In August 2021, the MCC Store celebrated its official grand re-opening, the first time that students, employees, and other customers were able to physically enter the store to purchase books and merchandise. Several events in August and September targeted key customer segments to visit the store and explore new, limited edition merchandise.

Through April of this current fiscal year, the MCC Store is now trending more positively than we have seen in several years. With fiscal sales in the first 10 months of the year at \$825,719.05, the MCC Store have already surpassed the entire prior fiscal year with two additional months still to go. These additional months of May and June are projected to be strong sales months. Expenses are running steady with the prior fiscal year, with the exception of Freight & Shipping expenses, which have doubled due to surcharges from the delivery companies.

MCC Upward Bound Program Receives Grant for Additional Five Years

Upward Bound provides opportunities for participants to succeed in their precollege performance and ultimately in their higher education pursuits. Serving high school students from low-income families and high school students from families in which neither parent holds a bachelor's degree, Upward Bound's goal is to increase the rate at which participants complete secondary education and enroll in and graduate from institutions of postsecondary education.

For the past five years, MCC's Upward Bound program has been working directly with students at Harvard High School in Harvard Community Unit School District (CUSD) 50. This program has provided these students various learning and enrichment opportunities, both during the school year and in the summer, including: tutoring; workshops on key topics like study skills, college planning and financial aid; check-in meetings to monitor progress; academic instruction; and other immersive college experiences. We have received notification this week that MCC has been selected to receive continued grant funding under the Upward Bound Program. This grant from the Department of Education will be in the amount of \$297,023.00 for the first budget period (September 2022-August 2023), with an anticipated duration of five years. Congratulations to MCC's Upward Bound team and our strong partners from CUSD 50 on the amazing progress thus far. We are excited to be continuing this very important work into the coming five years.

Executive Summary

Fiscal Year 2022 is currently 91.4% complete with the year-to-date results ending May 31, 2022 being reported. In the Operating Funds, total revenue is 66.5% of budget, as compared with 67.3% at the same time last year. Total expenditures are 60.3% of budget, as compared with 59.6% of budget at the same time last year. The Operating Funds include both the Education Fund and the Operations and Maintenance Fund, and together comprise most of the instruction and instructional support activities of the College. The following items relate to the Operating Funds (Fund 01 and Fund 02) as a whole:

Revenue

- <u>Local governmental</u> is 94.0% of budget and up \$968,703 (3.8%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$26,543,811 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$25,575,108. For FY 2022, this revenue is derived from 50% of the 2020 tax levy (as approved by the Board in November 2020) and 50% of the 2021 tax levy (as approved by the Board in November 2021).
- State government is 95.6% of budget and up \$345,301 (9.8%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$3,878,427 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$3,533,126.
- Federal government is 0.0% of budget and down \$48,933 (-97.4%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$1,328 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$50,261.
- Student tuition and fees is 102.0% of budget and up \$203,058 (1.5%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$13,622,621 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$13,419,562. Budgeted tuition and fees revenue is calculated based on a calculated net billable credit hours and not total reported credit hours, which includes dual credit. Dual credit only generates tuition revenue if these classes are held on campus with our instructors.
- Sales and service fee is 140.7% of budget and up \$62,041 (509.8%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$74,212 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$12,171. Activity in this area is comprised primarily from the Kids and College, Fitness Center, Horticulture Sales, and Sweet Scots.
- <u>Facilities</u> is 96.8% of budget and even \$0 (0.0%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$18,366 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$18,366. Revenue in this category is comprised of the leasing of the land owned by the College to the radio station and as farmland.
- <u>Investment</u> is -68.6% of budget and down \$460,793 (-415.3%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is -\$349,836 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$110,957.
- Nongovernmental gifts, scholarships, grants & bequests is 217.7% of budget and up \$14,726 (159.7%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$23,945 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$9,219. Activity is due to contributions from the Foundation for faculty requested needs (travel, software, etc.).
- Other is 19.4% of budget and down \$26,023 (-0.5%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 revenue is \$5,365,373 vs. FY 2021 revenue of \$5,391,396. The main items in this category consists largely of Employee Health Insurance Contributions, which account for \$5,249,108, Retiree Health contributions, which account for \$448, Other Misc. Income, which account for \$72,952 with the remaining balance being made up of smaller accounts such as NSF charges, assorted fines, fees, and miscellaneous income all of which total \$42,865. The large variance to budget is the result of the "On-Behalf Payment" for the employer's pension contribution for employees made by the State. For FY 2021 that "On-Behalf Payment" was \$20,487,712.

Expenditures

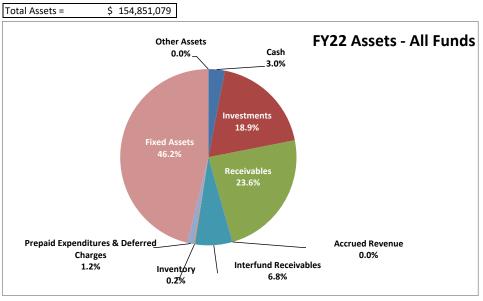
- <u>Salaries</u> expenditures are 84.4% of budget and up \$293,948 (1.3%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$23,795,357 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$23,501,409.
- Employee benefit expenditures are 27.4% of budget and up \$222,592 (2.6%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$8,802,454 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$8,579,862. This line item is dependent on the health experience or the use of benefits by the employee group and their own independent choice of coverage. Therefore, it will always be difficult to budget in advance to any degree of certainty and will experience good years and bad years as a result. This account group will always be significantly below budget until year-end adjustments are made for SURS contributions paid by the State on behalf of the employees. The amount expensed for SURS contributions are about \$17-20 million annually depending on the actuarial tables maintained by the State. However, this expense is offset by an equal amount in "other revenue" and therefore has no effect on the operating performance of the College.
- <u>Contractual services</u> expenditures are 96.0% of budget and up \$184,309 (4.9%) from last year at
 this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$3,977,864 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$3,793,555. The
 account includes contractual services for custodial services, legal services, construction
 management, roads and grounds, and architectural type services.
- Materials and supplies expenditures are 100.9% of budget and up \$1,067,585 (50.1%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$3,200,540 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$2,132,955.
- <u>Travel and meeting</u> expenditures are 83.6% of budget and up \$105,712 (85.2%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$229,739 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$124,027.
- <u>Fixed charges</u> expenditures are 104.7% of budget and up \$46,117 (2.8%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$1,692,249 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$1,646,131. Included in this category are bond principal, interest payments, lease payments, and general insurance.
- <u>Utilities</u> expenditures are 78.4% of budget and up \$36,487 (4.0%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$950,061 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$913,574.
- <u>Capital Outlay</u> expenditures are 59.0% of budget and up \$972,234 (147.0%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$1,633,549 vs. FY21 expenditures of \$661,315. *Please be aware that large projects started in one fiscal year may cross into a new fiscal year and will therefore have an impact on two fiscal years (i.e. one year under budget and the next over budget).*
- Other expenditures are 77.9% of budget and down \$93,647 (-11.7%) from last year at this time.
 FY 2022 expenditures are \$707,581 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$801,228. The main category of expenses includes tuition waivers, tuition related refunds, and miscellaneous expense.
- Contingency expenditures are 0.0% of budget and even \$0 (0.0%) from last year at this time. FY 2022 expenditures are \$0 vs. FY 2021 expenditures of \$0.

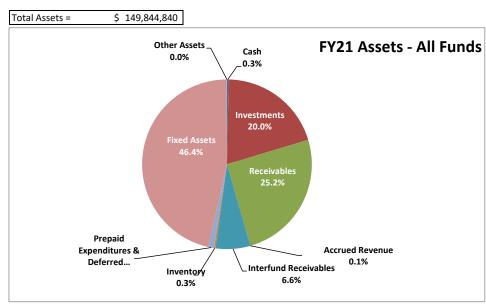

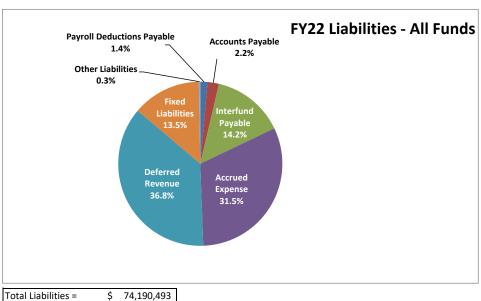

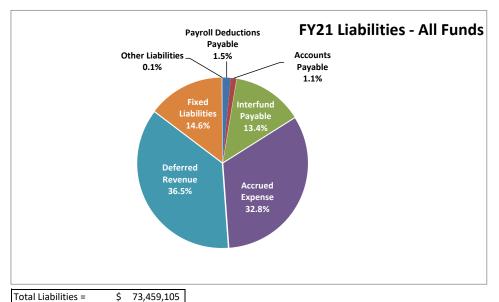

All Funds Statement of Net Position (Balance Sheet) May 31, 2022



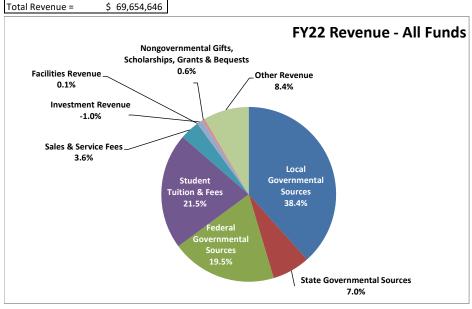


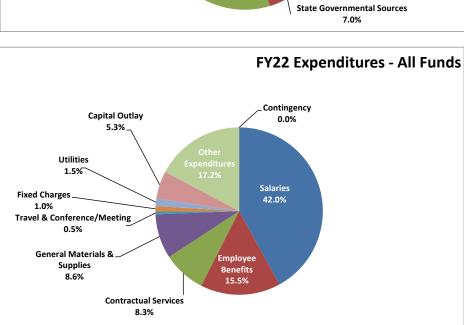




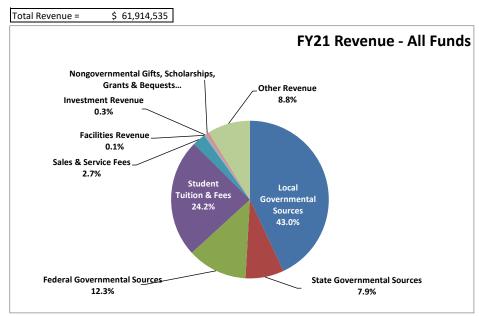

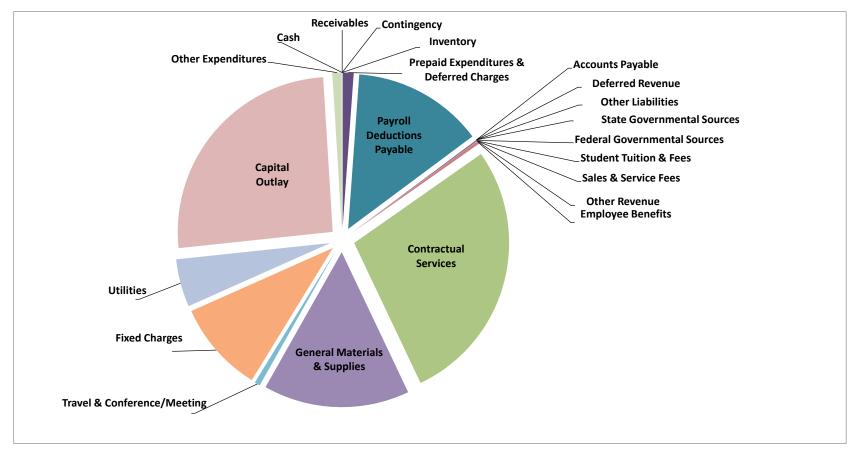

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Revised Academic Calendar for 2022-2023

<u>Information</u>

Each year the Office of Academic Affairs and Workforce Development partners with Faculty Council and Student Affairs to develop an Academic Calendar. The purpose of the Academic Calendar is to provide the schedule framework for the major academic and student support activities occurring at the College during an academic year.

Governor J.B. Pritzker recently signed Senate Bill 825, which makes changes to the state election laws. Some of these changes affect school district calendars, requiring schools to be made available to be polling places for the November 8, 2022 General Election, and establishes November 8, 2022 as an official state holiday for schools and public state offices.

Therefore, the College is required to close on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 to be available as a polling place. This date is added to the revised 2022-2023 Academic Calendar.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approves the revised Academic Calendar for 2022-2023 including the Tuesday, November 8, 2022 closure date.

Ferrilli Colleague Support Services Renewal

Ferrilli, LLC has provided specialized monitoring, support, and software upgrade services for the College's Ellucian Colleague Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system for the past several years. These specialized services supplement the standard annual support service provided by Ellucian, ensuring that critical tasks are addressed in a timely manner. This proposal is to extend these services for another year.

The specialized support services includes:

- Colleague software and database updates (patches) and maintenance
- WebAdvisor, UI (User Interface), and Student Self-Service upgrades and performance tuning
- Business Intelligence (WebI) server support and performance tuning
- Server security certificate management
- Server operating system upgrades for the above
- 24 x 7 uptime monitoring
- 4 hours of additional phone support each month

Time period: 8/1/2022 - 7/31/2023

Cost: \$53,400.00

This purchase is exempt from bidding requirements as stated in the Illinois Public Community College Act Chapter 110 ILCS 805/3-27.1, exemption (f) which reads, "purchase and contracts for the use, purchase, delivery, movement or installation of data processing equipment, software, or services and telecommunications and inter-connect equipment, software and services."

This expense is budgeted in the IT DevOps Services account in the Education Fund.

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approves the Ferrilli Colleague Support Services renewal proposal from Ferrilli LLC, of Haddonfield, NJ covering the period August 1, 2022 through July 31, 2023 for \$53,400.00.

Ferrilli Database Administration Services

Ferrilli is a Higher Education Technology Consultant company that is currently providing support services to MCC related to the Colleague ERP system. There is a need to expand the service scope to include support for other databases and database-related tasks, including performing critical patching and updates. These services are specialized and outside the skill set of MCC staff.

Some of additional responsibilities included in this proposal include:

- SQL database maintenance
- 24x7 uptime monitoring and response
- SQL server performance tuning and optimization
- SQL server service pack, cumulative updates, and hotfix installation
- Installing, configuring, and maintaining SQL servers, integration services, analysis services, and reporting services
- Managing database access and security
- 12 hours of general consulting per month

The current support agreement with Ferrilli expires on July 31, 2022.

These services and supplies are exempt from bidding requirements as stated in the Illinois Public Community College Act Chapter 110 ILCS 805/3-27.1, exemption (f) which reads, "purchase and contracts for the use, purchase, delivery, movement or installation of data processing equipment, software, or services and telecommunications and inter-connect equipment, software and services."

This expense is budgeted in the IT DevOps account within the Education Fund.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approves the Ferrilli Database Administration Services proposal from Ferrilli LLC, of Haddonfield, NJ covering the period August 1, 2022 through July 31, 2023 for \$90,000.

Microsoft Enterprise Agreement Renewal

McHenry County College has relied on Microsoft-based technologies for many years and continues to leverage Microsoft products to deliver superior technology services for students, faculty, and staff. These services support a wide array of technologies, such as desktop computing, servers, database, and security systems.

Microsoft products are typically licensed to organizations based on organizational size and usage. As higher volumes of licenses are needed, the greater the discount offered by Microsoft. In prior years, Microsoft licensed their products to the College using a count of existing FTE staff at our institution. Five years ago, Microsoft altered its licensing program to enable the College to leverage its participation in the Illinois Public Higher Education Cooperative (IPHEC) using an Enterprise Agreement to leverage the purchasing power of government and educational institutions across the state. Since the College participates in IPHEC, Microsoft licensing is now based on the cumulative count of staff and students for all colleges in the Consortium. This positions the College as a much larger entity, which drives larger discounts. It also enables the College to save approximately 35% or more on its annual Microsoft licensing costs compared to independently acquiring the licenses without the Consortium. This year's total cost for licensing all Microsoft products campus-wide is \$216,663.53. The current Microsoft agreement expires August 31, 2022.

Through IPHEC, Microsoft has named CDW-G as the sole source provider for all qualifying institutions in the state of Illinois. This consortium pricing is based on a 4000+ FTE staff employee count and allows for superior pricing not available through any other source. The Agreement provides for the following number of technologies and services:

VMware Licensing and Support Contracts Renewal

Information

The College leverages technology virtualization to deliver services that were once only possible for large, global organizations – these services include desktop virtualization and disaster recovery. These virtualization technologies are being applied at both the desktop computer user level and "back-end" data center server level. VMware, Inc. is a global leader in virtualization technology. Several years ago, the College chose VMware as its primary provider of virtualization technology and is continuing to leverage VMware in key areas in support of its Strategic Plan.

This request addresses the renewal of annual VMware virtualization technology licensing and support in the College's data centers. There are two primary VMware components required to license and support VMware technologies. Three licenses are required for an administrative server referred to as "VCenter", which is used to manage, administer, and monitor the College's 24 VMware servers. Additionally, two separate licenses are required for each of the College's 24 VMware servers since each server runs dual processors. A license is required for each processor. These 24 VMware servers currently run a total of 585 virtual servers, which include mission-critical College systems such as email servers, the desktop virtualization environment, and the Ellucian Colleague ERP system. Due to a server consolidation process over the last couple of years, we were able to reduce the number of licenses needed. This represents a cost savings of \$42,000.00 over the three-year period that this proposal covers.

The College's current VMware server and VCenter license and support contracts are expiring on September 6, 2022. The long-term cost of contract renewals can be reduced by using a three-year time period of September 7, 2022 to September 6, 2025. A three-year renewal period will save approximately 11% annually, or roughly \$13,902.00 over the course of the three-year contracts. The cost for these license and support renewals will be \$42,128.46 per year over the three-year period. These license and support renewals will allow the College to stay in licensing compliance and enable IT to call VMware technical support when problems arise.

Request to Purchase NeoEd Talent Management Software

Information

Talent Management is a key component of Human Resources service delivery, which includes recruiting and applicant tracking, onboarding, and performance evaluation. It affects all College departments as full-time faculty, adjunct faculty, administrators, staff, and many contingent personnel are hired through the system, and many serve on search committees. It is imperative that the College has an accurate and user-friendly system for all individuals, with customizable options that adapt to changing organizational conditions and processes.

The College has used People Admin for talent management since 2013, which has not kept pace with modern features. NeoEd's Human Resources software suite is designed for public and higher education institutions, and its partnership with Ellucian will allow data to integrate and import directly with our current Ellucian Colleague enterprise system, reducing manual administrative processes. The recruiting module includes features aligned to MCC's DEBI efforts, such as the ability to hide candidate information to reduce screening bias, and reporting of key demographics. By purchasing NeoEd software, MCC can streamline and connect talent management processes and improve workflow transparency and communication. NeoEd software is EEO, FCRA, and ADA compliant. The costs are comparable to the current system People Admin annual costs.

Request to Purchase Outdoor Advertising

MCC Duplication Center Services for FY 2023

Information

Since January 2022, the College has contracted with Stan's LPS Midwest for operator support because of a temporary staffing need in the College's Duplication Center. During this time, a member of Stan's team has been onsite to operate the day-to-day printing and production needs requested through the Duplication Center's services. At the conclusion of this trial period, we have determined that this approach to operating the Duplication Center via Stan's has been successful.

As the College's sole-source supplier of the complete printer/copier fleet across campus, Stan's has extensive familiarity with managing MCC's standard and large-format duplication equipment. Because of this expertise, as well as better access to service and repair technicians and the overall cost-effectiveness of hiring a contractual partner for operating these machines, this proposal is to extend these services with Stan's on an annual basis, effective for FY 2023.

The goal of this new Duplication Center structure is to maximize services provided to employees, as well as continue to implement efficiencies that make center operations run more smoothly and with little-to-no downtime. With this partnership, Stan's is also providing support to move the Duplication Center to a new, online project request process for all duplication requests. This new process will be accessible from anywhere to request print jobs and track status of jobs. Additional benefits of this partnership will include:

- 25 hours of service per week, onsite in MCC's Duplication Center
- Monitoring, processing, and managing job tickets and service requests, and meeting deadlines for all B&W and color printing jobs
- Development of speciality print jobs
- Bindery
- Lamination
- Cutting/folding
- Management of supplies and paper stock
- Weekly delivery to Shah Center in McHenry for enhanced service delivery
- Weekly check-in for internal customer feedback, product quality inspection, contract and policy compliance, and review of Key Performance Indicators

The cost of this service agreement is \$3,684.00 per month and includes a one-time software maintenance & support fee of \$1,499.00. Combined, the annual total for the FY 2023 agreement is \$45,707.00. Any additional services needed over the 25 hours per week included would be billed independently at \$32/hour.

This purchase is exempt from bidding requirements as stated in the Illinois Public Community College Act Chapter 110 ILCS 805/3-27.1, exemption (b) which reads, "contracts for the printing of finance committee reports and departmental reports"; exemption (e) which reads, "contracts for the maintenance or servicing of, or provision of repair parts for, equipment which are made with the manufacturer or authorized service agent of that equipment where the provision of parts, maintenance,

or servicing can best be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service agent"; and exemption (f) which reads, "purchase and contracts for the use, purchase, delivery, movement or installation of data processing equipment, software, or services and telecommunications and inter-connect equipment, software and services".

This expense is budgeted in the Duplication account in the Education Fund.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approves the annual FY 2023 contract for duplication center services from Stan's – LPS Midwest of Woodstock, IL not to exceed \$45,707.00.

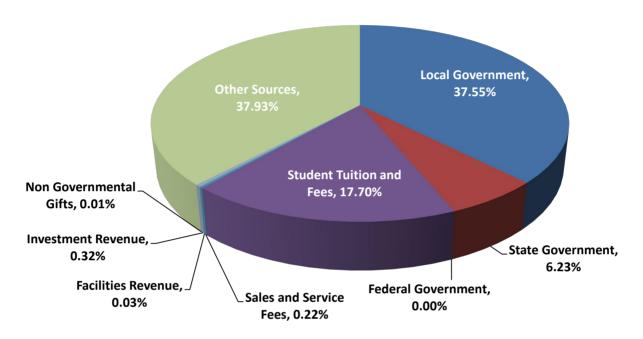

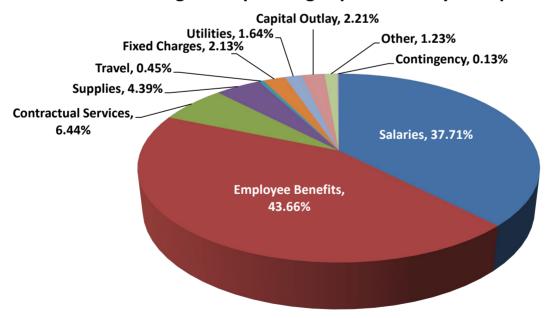

Fiscal Year 2024 Resource Allocation Management Program (RAMP)

<u>Information</u>

These Resource Allocation Management Program (RAMP) submissions are the official requests of the College for state funding for specific capital improvement projects. It is a requirement of the Illinois Board of Higher Education through the Illinois Community College Board to assist the State in resource allocation and budget planning.

Due to changes in State capital budgeting and processes of the ICCB over the last few years, the RAMP submission process itself has been changed. All RAMP projects submitted prior to FY 2020, which were not funded in the last year, have been eliminated. All remaining projects within the system were removed and the RAMP process itself started fresh with the FY 2022 RAMP submissions; submissions are brought forth for approval at the June Board meeting each fiscal year. This June the Board is approving the FY2024 RAMP submission.

With the change and complete restart of the RAMP process, it has provided all higher education institutions the ability to submit projects based on current/future needs for consideration dependent on state funding.

The three projects to be included in this year's RAMP document and prioritized are:

- 1) Multi-Purpose Center Addition (\$16,378,206)
- 2) First Responder Training Center (\$11,607,176)
- 3) Library/Student Success Center Renovation (\$10,046,747)

The combined FY 2024 cost, with the escalation factor applied for all three projects in this submission is estimated at \$38,032,129. The College is requesting that the State appropriate 75% estimated at \$28,524,097 with local funds supporting the remaining 25% estimated at \$9,508,032.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approves the FY 2024 Resource Allocation Management Program (RAMP) projects submissions, which include the Multi-Purpose Center Addition, First Responder Training Center, and Library/Student Success Center Renovation, to the Illinois Community College Board as presented for a total cost of \$38,032,129 with a required local match of \$9,508,032.

Project Scope:

In order to address the lack of large meeting space on campus to support events such as career fairs, college fairs, and industry-related events, as well as to create space to support the health and wellness of the college community and the community-at-large, a new addition and a series of renovations to the existing facilities will need to be implemented. The general scope of work will include the following:

Proposed New Multi-Purpose Addition (approx. 24,600 SF)

- 1. Large Multi-Purpose Room
- 2. Pre-Function Space
- 3. Storage Space
- 4. Elevated Walking Track
- 5. Office Space
- 6. Concessions Space

Renovations (approx. 9,950 SF)

- 1. Upgrade existing home team locker rooms / training room, improve handicap accessibility, replace existing MEP infrastructure, and replace deteriorated lockers and finishes
- 2. Create space for visiting team locker rooms that does not currently exist
- 3. Relocate the existing Fitness Center from the second floor down to the first floor, adjacent to the locker rooms, in order to improve accessibility for the community. This move is also required to free up space to accommodate the growth of the Library / Teaching & Learning Center on the 2nd Floor

The addition and renovation work is proposed to be developed at the southwest corner of the existing campus, adjacent to the existing Gymnasium and Conference Center. A new, more inviting entry for the community-at-large will be created at this public entrance to the College which is highly visible from US Highway 14. Due to the proximity of the proposed addition to the existing parking on campus, the existing parking lot will be slightly re-configured to accommodate the new construction and to provide a drop-off / pick-up area lane for vehicles. There is currently adequate, under-utilized parking on the south side of the campus, and therefore, no additional parking will be required.

In keeping with the College's commitment to sustainability, the new facility will also incorporate "green" design strategies consistent with LEED certification requirements.

Multi-Purpose Center

An expansion of A-Building to house a new Multi-Purpose Center is needed to accommodate and expand existing programs for athletics and to be able to develop new ones or make available the space used by the community and internal users that compete with athletic use of the same facility. The current space serves not only internal campus needs but the residents of the larger McHenry County area. This causes disruptions and scheduling conflicts for athletics for the use of the same space for competition and practice sessions forcing athletics to seek other venues.

Therefore, in order to address the lack of a large open meeting space on campus to support events such as career fairs, college fairs, and industry-related events, as well as to create space to support the health and wellness of the college community and the community-at-large, a new addition and a series of renovations to the existing facilities will need to be implemented. The general scope of work will include the following:

Proposed New Addition (approx. 24,600 SF)

A new open space is needed that will allow for large events that cannot be hosted in existing spaces and that will not compete with athletics. This new addition will be adjacent to the existing multi-purpose room and will extend into the B parking lot area.

Renovations (approx. 9,950 SF)

Additionally, renovations to the existing spaces surrounding the multi-purpose are needed to improve the space to accommodate athletic and fitness center needs.

- •Upgrade existing home team locker rooms and training room, improve handicap accessibility, replace existing MEP infrastructure, replace deteriorated lockers and finishes
- •Create space for visiting team locker rooms that does not currently exist and officials.
- •Relocate the existing Fitness Center from the Second Floor down to the First Floor, adjacent to the Locker Rooms, in order to improve accessibility for the community.
- •This move is also required to free up space to accommodate the growth of the Library / Teaching & Learning Center on the 2nd Floor.

These above renovations are necessary to in order to improve outdated and inadequate facilities. A new, more inviting entry for the community-at-large will be created at this public entrance to the College which is highly visible from US Highway 14. Due to the proximity of the proposed addition to the existing parking on campus, the existing parking lot will need to be slightly re-configured to accommodate the new construction and to provide a drop-off / pick-up area lane for vehicles.

The total estimated new facility project cost, in keeping with the College's commitment to sustainability, will also incorporate "green" design strategies consistent with LEED certification requirements.

First Responder Training Center

A First Responder Training Center at McHenry County College is needed to accommodate and expand existing programs and to be able to develop new ones that will serve the residents of the larger McHenry County area needs. Current space restrictions limit the ability and type of training current programs can offer, in particular Fire Science and Criminal Justice.

The College is also exploring a training center for police academy training. Current academy training is limited with no coverage in the northeast portion of Illinois. The lack of academy training options has caused delays in training new officers until spots are available. Additionally, there is support from the surrounding municipal and county law enforcement agencies for the College to develop a training academy and to be able to host a training center that can be utilized by law enforcement agencies to meet the demand for continuing training of officers.

The College is looking to expand courses currently offered and to partner with North East Multi-Regional Training (NEMRT) and Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board) as well as other agencies that will improve the content and quality of program offerings. The expanded programs will include offering state certified criminal justice courses to current police officers and first responders, offering advanced professional development courses to law enforcement officers and to develop either a part-time or full-time police training academy.

The First Responder Training Center will include a Proposed New Multi-Purpose/Garage Space (approx. 22,000 SF). This new space will allow for flexible inside training for both individuals and vehicles. Currently, the College lacks space to instruct users on vehicles that include ambulances, fire engines, police cruisers, and other emergency vehicles.

The First Responder Training Center will also include a Proposed New Classroom/Office Space (approx. 4,500 SF). Currently, the College lacks adequate space for all its current training needs, especially in the Fire Sciences, which at times is forced to use common hallways and stairways for training. These new classrooms in conjunction with the open multi-purpose space will provide dedicated classrooms for all first responder training.

The First Responder Training Center will include a new Proposed New Burn Tower. Currently, the existing burn tower is beyond its service life and is in need of a full restoration. A full restoration is not a cost effective solution as the burn tower is limited in its capabilities. The current burn tower is not able to provide the full suite of fire science training and is not modular so expansion is not feasible. The new burn tower will be multiple levels with different configuration options and have the ability to expand as may be needed for future training.

The First Responder Training Center will includes proposed site work that will consist of the construction of new structures as well as site work to support the needs of the Fire Science, EMT (Emergency Medical Technician), and Criminal Justice programs on campus. The proposed new complex is currently being planned to be located at the southeast portion of the existing campus on property that was recently acquired by the College and will include the following:

Access Drive/Parking for Approximately 40 Vehicles to handle the students that will utilize the new center. An Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) Pad (150' 450') that will be used for first

The Library concept in higher education has changes and the dated, physical space itself is in need of renovations and upgrades. The project scope includes the reconfiguration of the floorplan to reflect the interactive functions required of a modern Library. The purpose of the combined \$2,500,000.00 in transfers from the Education Fund (01) and Operations and Maintenance Fund (02) to the Operations and Maintenance Restricted Fund (03) is necessitated in order to properly fund the construction and equipping of the Foglia Center for Technology and Innovation. This is due to inflationary pressures that have escalated the cost of the overall project. The FY 2022 Budget is expected to perform well and has the capacity this year to allow the recommended transfer of \$2,500,000.00.

Administrative Compensation Adjustment for FY 2023

Sustainability Center Update

Current Initiatives

- MCC's Sustainability Center completed its second program review and presented it to the MCC
 President's Cabinet in May. The program review process is typically completed every five years for nonacademic departments and then shared with the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB). Detailed
 information on a variety of sustainability initiatives including energy consumption and production,
 composting program, and Re-Use It Corner savings calculations were provided in the review and will be
 available on the MCC Sustainability center website (www.mchenry.edu/green) soon. Additional
 information was provided on student interaction with the solar energy sites(s), composting program,
 and sustainability related curriculum.
- MCC's Shah Center in McHenry was the host for the Environmental Defenders of McHenry County program Best Management Practices: Energy Savings During the IL Solar Revolution on May 13, 2022. The event was co-sponsored by the MCC Sustainability Center, and Director Hankins provided a presentation on the Shah Center solar project with a tour of the onsite solar array. Hal Sprague, with Trajectory Energy Partners, spoke about the Climate and Equitable Jobs Act (CEJA) law that gives municipalities, businesses, nonprofits, and schools opportunities to host their own solar projects. Approximately 40 people from local municipalities and school districts attended.
- The Sustainability Center is delighted to participate in the New Student Orientations throughout the summer.
- The ComEd Retro- commissioning project final report of recommendations was provided to the MCC Sustainability Center and Facilities Management staff in May 2022. There is a proposed annual energy savings of over 400,000 kWh. MCC staff are working with the project partners to implement the recommendations and apply for the ComEd incentives to cover the costs.
- The ReUse It Corner has repurposed approximately \$873.89 worth of gently used office supplies in May 2022. Thirty-two people found uses for over 200 items this month.

Community Connections and Conferences

- The Sustainability Center and the Center for Agrarian Learning shared an information table at the Planet Palooza event, held on the Woodstock Square in May. Multiple environmental groups and social services had interactive displays as well.
- Director Hankins presented sessions on recycling to the Countryside Garden Club and Ridgefield
 Presbyterian Church in May the sessions were called "Recycling 101 What Do I Do with All This Other
 Stuff"

Workforce Development Update

Workforce Development at MCC provides noncredit educational programming for area employers and community members. This month, we are highlighting some of the program's subject-matter experts and instructors who work with each program area.

Career Training Program

Provides career-entry programs that lead to employer-recognized industry credentials.

Instructor: Angela Sass

Teaches: Phlebotomy, EKG, Medical Assistant

With more than 20 years of ICU experience, Angela Sass has been a valued teacher of both credit and noncredit medical courses at MCC for over 10 years. She enjoys the connection to patient care and tells her students that they can make a difference in someone's life by working in the healthcare professions. To note, she has been nominated as an Outstanding Faculty member five times. Angela earned a master's degree in nursing education at Northern Illinois University and a doctorate degree in educational leadership from American Sentinel University. Before coming to MCC, she worked as a full-time nurse at Amita Health St. Joseph Hospital in the ICU. Currently, she coordinates a clinical at Northwestern Medicine McHenry Hospital.

Court-Mandated Programs

In partnership with the McHenry County 22nd Judicial Court, this program provides mandatory parenting instruction for families undergoing divorce, as well as National Safety Council safe driving classes for traffic offenders.

Instructor: Zitlalli Roman Teaches: Focus on the Kids

As one of the newest instructors of the Focus on the Kids course taught through MCC's Court-Mandated Program, Zitlalli Roman will be meeting community needs by providing a Spanish language version of the class. She has been a PAIP (Partner Abuse Intervention Program) Facilitator and the Director of the Domestic Violence Program at Turning Point in Woodstock, IL for six years. Zitlalli previously earned a master's degree in social work (with a child and family concentration) from University of Illinois at Chicago and a bachelor's degree in social work from Northeastern Illinois University. Her case management experience includes working with refugees for World Relief Chicago – Legal Services and RefugeeOne, as a clinical case worker for the Carol Stream Police Department Social Service Unit, and as the Latino Program Assistant at Family Shelter Service, a program of Metropolitan Family Services DuPage. She ensures victims are no longer in crisis by assisting with legal advocacy, crisis intervention, counseling, and resource referral.

Personal Development and Kids and College Programs

Provides career exploration and awareness programming as well as lifelong learning opportunities.
