Olivet Nazarene University's RN-BSN program is offered online. Programs can be completed in as little as 15 months for the core nursing classes. A Personalized Learning Plan is completed for each student.

MCC has a partnership agreement with Olivet Nazarene University, allowing MCC ADN graduates who enroll in Olivet Nazarene University's RN-BSN program to qualify for a 20% tuition discount per credit hour. Students must enroll in the RN-BSN program within 12 months of graduating from MCC to receive the discount.

The BS in Nursing degree program is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) and approved by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation.

Application and Admission Requirements

- Submit a completed Olivet Nazarene University application form. Application fee of \$50 waived for MCC students. Online application can be found here: https://online.olivet.edu/apply-now
- Associate degree in nursing from a regionally accredited institution or a diploma from a school for registered nurse education
- Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions (transcript with the registrar's seal from the institution granting credit sent directly to the Olivet Nazarene University, Graduate and Continuing Studies)
- Submit a copy of a current R.N. license
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or better (4.0 scale) from all credits transferred from institutions previously attended.

Additional Information

- Maximum transfer credit The RN-BSN degree requires 120 credits. A minimum of 38 credits are required to be taken through Olivet (including core curriculum). A maximum of 82 credits can be taken from MCC.
- **Grade requirement** Courses with grade of C or above are eligible for transfer consideration; a minimum grade of C is required for each course of the Nursing major and supporting courses (A&P courses, Life Span Development, Sociology, Pathophysiology, Statistics, Nutrition, Microbiology). A 2.75 GPA is required to progress in Nursing courses and to graduate with the BSN.
- Six credits of Christianity core general education are required: BIB 215 Understanding the Bible and THE 300 Faith and Contemporary Issues or THE 310 Christianity & Culture
