The College of Business is accredited by AACSB International – the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business.

Transfer Options

- Redbird Promise guaranteed admission to the University (not to specific major) Specific requirements are as follows:
 - o Complete the Redbird Promise Participation Form.
 - o Complete AA or AS degree prior to Illinois State enrollment.
 - Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.4/4.0 in all transferable academic coursework (at all colleges/universities attended) and be in good academic standing at your community college.
- Recommended Completion of the AA degree that includes lower-level College of Business tool courses prior to transfer
- **General Education** The following options satisfy ISU's general education requirements for transfer students (It is important to incorporate general education courses that apply towards ISU's business programs):
 - IAI GECC, including a global studies course (AMALI)
 - o An MCC AA degree, including a global studies course (AMALI)
 - o Business programs require specific courses.
- For students who transfer prior to completing an AA degree or the IAI core:
 - o ISU credit can be transferred back to MCC for completion of AA degree.
 - o IAI core may be completed at ISU by taking ISU-approved IAI courses.

Admission to the College of Business

- Application and Admission Transfer students submit an application to the Office of Admissions for acceptance into
 the University, indicating major of interest. University admission standards for transfer students must be met. For

- Application preferred filing period:
 - Summer & Fall: Application Deadline May 1, Required Document Deadline June 1, Preferred Filing Period –
 September 1 January 15
 - Spring: Application Deadline November 1; Required Document Deadline November 1; Preferred Filing Period
 April 1 August 1.
- Admission criteria In addition to meeting University admission standards, the College of Business requires transfer students to meet a minimum 2.5 GPA requirement.

Additional Information

Students are highly encouraged to complete the AA degree or IAI GECC and as many of the tool business courses below prior to transfer (a "C" or better is required for all tool courses).

- *Business Education: Students interested in Business Education do not need to take Applied Calculus (MAT 171) or Calculus I (MAT 175). Rather, Finite (MAT 127) is all that's required for this major.
- All major related courses require a minimum grade of C or better.
- Maximum hours from a community college Up to 70 academic credits may be transferred from a community college.
- Catalog Rule Transfer students are placed in the catalog associated with their term of ISU admission. A transfer student is eligible for a previous catalog (up to 2 years prior to assigned catalog) if it is in the student's best interest. Transfer admission counselors will work closely with transfer students to make sure students are not disadvantaged. Please note that mandatory State of Illinois standards for Business-Education majors takes precedence over the Catalog Rule.
- Global Studies (AMALI) At least one approved course in Global Studies (AMALI) is a graduation requirement (see chart on following page).
- Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Access in U.S. Society (IDEAS Graduation Requirement: for more information, review the IDEAS statement in the General ISU Transfer Guide.
- <u>Fixed Tuition Pledge</u> Illinois State locks in tuition and fees for four years.
- <u>Transfer Student Scholarship</u> (NEW: automatic!) Up to \$3,000 (up to \$1,500 per year, renewable for two years of undergraduate career). The Transfer Student Scholarship is automatically awarded to first-time transfer students based on academic merit and the competitiveness of the applicant pool, beginning with students applying for summer 2020. To be eligible, students must have at least a 3.5 cumulative transfer GPA and apply for admission in the <u>preferred filing period</u>. Students must have at least 12 earned college-level credit hours by the end of the filing period and 24 credit hours completed hours by the time of enrollment. No separate scholarship application is required. Award winners will be notified on a rolling basis, and awards will be offered as funds remain available.

Education Plan

The following plan will satisfy requirements for MCC's AA degree, the College of Business lower-level tool courses and computer competency, and ISU'S general education core.
